Be Punctual

Avoid Being Disruptive

Maintain silence in the presentation halls. Precious minutes are wasted in getting an audience quiet during and in between presenters.

Time Your Breaks

Stay for the duration of a talk. If you need a break, wait for a natural transition. Do not walk in and out in the middle of a session.

Dress Professionally

Dress in formal attire, whether that is Western or Indian. Save the jeans and flip-flops for post-conference events.

Don't Skip & Run

Ask yourself if you have come to listen and learn, or to talk and run.

Turn Off Your Phone

A ringing phone or incessant buzzing can be incredibly distracting to the concentration of the speaker and the audience.

Copyright And Plagiarism

Do not portray others work as your own.

Credit people and reference data
appropriately. Do not use copyrighted
material without permission.

Respect

Respect Everyone. Any type of disruption or violence will be met with expulsion and legal consequences.
